Task: Write a 4 paragraph essay about the United States and the League of Nations.

Prompt: After World War I, President Wilson's vision for an international agency that protects world peace was realized through the establishment of the League of Nations. Despite the view of the President however, the United States never joined the LofN. Write a 4 paragraph paper exploring **two different** reasons for the senate's decision not to join it.

Expectations:

- 4 paragraph long (1 paragraph intro with a thesis statement, 2 paragraphs argument for your thesis, 1 paragraph conclusion.)
- You must use at least 3 sources (quotes) throughout your essay. These come from your primary source packets
- Clear statements with minimal grammatical errors and professional tone

Intro:

- This paragraph should talk about the War and how it created the need for an international agency to protect the peace internationally. (Khan academy article might help you here.)
- Come up with a clear thesis. "The United States chose not to join" is not a thesis.

Reason 1 and 2

- The primary source packets lists several reasons as to why the United States did not join. Use two claimed by the primary sources and argue it by connecting it to your thesis.

Conclusion

- Don't just summarize what you said before. Connect the arguments you have just made to your thesis and end it in a thought provoking way.
